





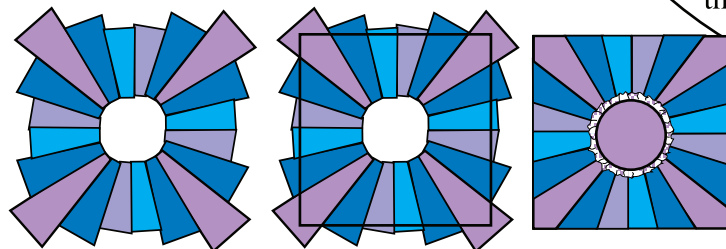
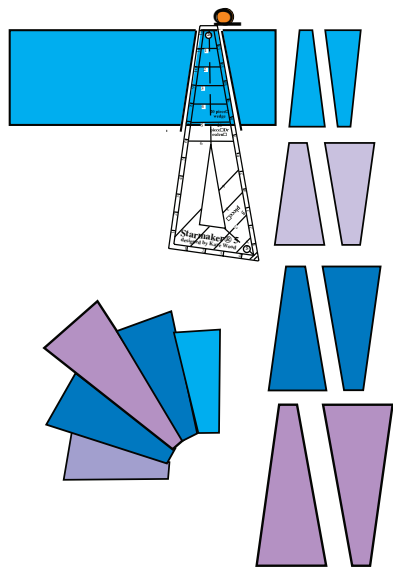
# Quilting the Kaye Wood Way

## It's a great beginner project!

The parasol block can also be used as a quilt block, See the "Victorian Sampler Quilt" in the book, *Strip Quilting Projects 9*.

-  Cut 1 strip 5" x 11"
-  Cut 1 strip 5" x 11"
-  Cut 1 strip 6" x 11"
-  Cut 1 strip 7½" x 11"

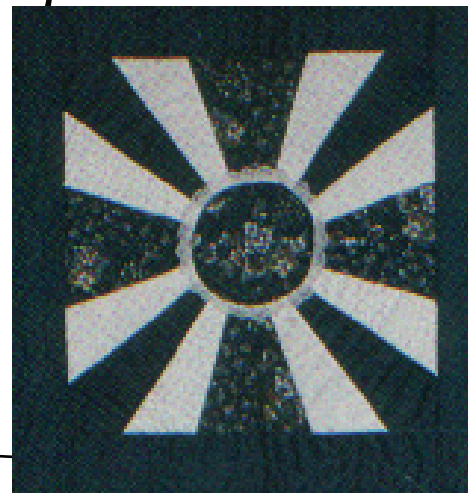


The e-book

*Fantastic Fans and Easy Wedge Designs*  
by Kaye Wood contains many different fans  
—most of them easy enough for a beginner.

The Starmaker® 5 is one of 3 Master Templates  
designed for strip cutting.

Several projects from this book are available on DVDs.



Place the Starmaker® 5's  
line under the 20 at the top of the strip.  
Cut on both sides to make a wedge shape.

*The 20 on the Starmaker® 5 means that  
20 of these pieces will make a circle.*

Turn the starmaker® 5 upside down,  
with the line at the bottom of the strip,  
to cut the second wedge shape.  
Cut 4 pieces from each strip of fabric.

Sew 20 pieces together into a circle  
using any color arrangement desired.

Square up the quilt block.

Cut a 4½" circle using the pattern.  
Sew lace to the outside edge of the circle.  
Press the seam allowances toward the circle.

Sew the circle to the quilt block by stitching  
in the ditch (seamline) between  
the lace and the circle.

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
