



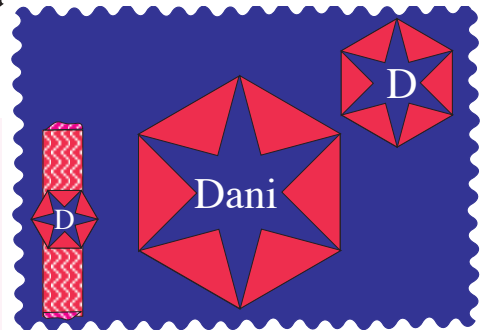

Patriotic Picnic

Great project
for kids.
No sewing!

Yardages for four placemats,
napkin holders and cup rings

Placemat	1 yd
Back	1 yd
Hexagons	1/3 yd
Triangles	1 yd
Fusible web	36 x 48 inches such as Steam-A-Seam 2



Placemat with Drink Coaster

Size: 14" x 18"

Cut 4 14" x 18" rectangles for the front of the placemats.
Cut 4 14" x 18" rectangles for the back of the placemats.
Fuse the two layers together, right sides out.

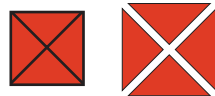
Large Hexagon:

Fuse the back of a 4 3/4" x 30" strip of red fabric.

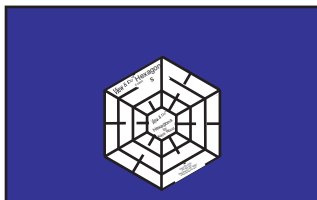
Cut this fused strip into 6 4 3/4" squares.



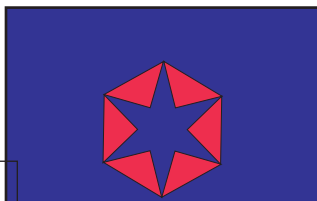
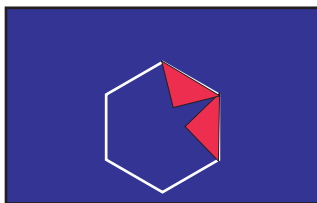
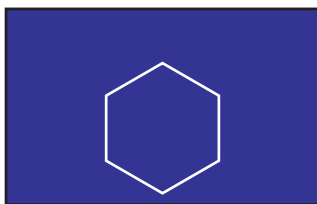
Cut each square diagonally in both directions to get 4 triangles.



For accurate placement, use the 8" View & Do™ Hexagon Shape to draw the hexagon shape.



Place 6 triangles around the drawn hexagon.
Fuse the triangles in place.



Medium Hexagon (drink coaster)

Fuse the back of a 2 1/4" x 24" strip of red fabric.

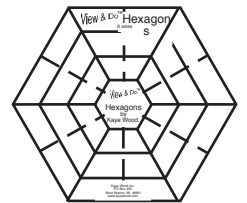
Cut this strip into 6 2 1/4" squares.

Cut each square diagonally in both directions to get 4 triangles.

Place 6 triangles on the placemat so they form a hexagon in the upper right hand corner. For accurate placement, use the 4" View & Do™ Hexagon Shape to draw the hexagon shape.

Fuse the triangles in place.

Finish edges of the placemat by rotary cutting with a wave or pinking blade, or use pinking shears, or serge or machine stitch around the edges.

rotary cutter.

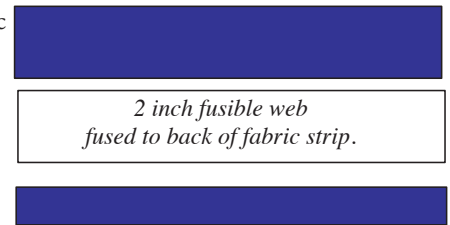
Napkin Holder

Fuse the wrong side of a fabric strip 2 x 18 inches.

Fold the strip in half (1 inch wide), wrong sides together and press to fuse.

Finish the edges by rotary cutting with a wave or pinking blade, or use pinking shears.

Cut each strip into four equal parts.



Fold and fuse wrong sides together.

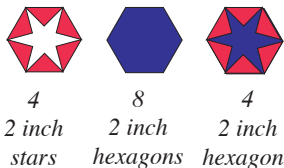

Small Hexagons (napkin holder)

Cut and fuse the back of a 2" x 13" background fabric.

Cut 8 2" fused hexagons from this strip.



Fuse the back of a 1½" x 10" strip of red fabric.

Cut this strip into 6 1½" squares; cut into 24 triangles.

Place the fused triangles to the front of 4 hexagons.

Bring the two ends of the napkin holder strip together. Adjust the length as needed.

Place a fused hexagon star to the right side of the joined ends.

Fuse a solid background fabric hexagon to the back of the front hexagon and the strip.

The strip ends will be enclosed.
